## Superintendent's Message from Dr. Tom Sharp

Many organizational duties are being addressed. Bookkeeping/financial standards are being tweaked to provide maximum utilization of budget demands. A new superintendent has been officially hired and will assist me in interviewing 2020-2021 staffing needs: one of which is K-12 principal due to the leaving of Principal Scott Harrington who will be principal at Adam Central next school year. Mr. Harrington has done a remarkable job especially during the transition period during October and November. Scott continues to perform admirably as a genuine educational leader and advocate for school children.

A special shout-out to the post-prom parents for organizing the silent auction fundraiser. The variety and quality of the auctioned items was impressive as is their goal to provide a safe and memorable prom experience for our deserving juniors and seniors. I recently talked to a group of our high ability learners about the responsibility of keeping each other safe.

One Saturday night at 10:45 pm when I was 16 years old, a schoolmate came by the junkyard and told me he needed help. He had been to a keg party, and he had a strict 11:00 pm curfew – strict enough that he was scared to miss it, fearing physical consequences for his mom and himself.

I asked how I could help. Why didn't he just go home on time? My classmate pointed to the back seat of his car where a passenger lay in an alcoholic stupor. The passenger was a 14 year old eighth grade girl who also had attended the keg party and hooked up with my schoolmate. Now he faced the problem of what to do with the girl. So he came to me. Why me? Because I had demonstrated to my classmates that I had accepted the responsibility of using my cognitive abilities to teach others, to help the less fortunate, to be kind to the uncertain, to be aware of what needed to be done, and to have a good supply of common sense. Now, when faced with a dilemma of facing enraged parents, both his and hers, he didn't continue his irresponsibility, thank God. He asked for help.

The only considering factor to me was to keep both of them safe, even at the risk I knew that I would have to take. I sent my classmate home and took possession of the girl. I placed her, still mostly unconscious, in the family tow truck because it was an emergency vehicle, and this was an emergency. I drove the intoxicated girl to her home and basically carried her to her front door. She reeked from alcoholic sickness and her clothes were in disarray. Her mother met me at the front door: I assume she had been worried and had been peering out looking for her daughter. I handed her over to her mother as her father came running.

Before any words were exchanged, I spoke out. "My name is Tom Sharp. My father is Roy Sharp. We own the tow service. Your daughter has been to a keg party where she drank things she shouldn't have drank, and she did things she shouldn't have done. I have brought her home to keep her safe."

The parents thanked me, and I left. They saved their questions for their daughter to answer later. They did not grill me for answers. They didn't call the police. They cared for their daughter's immediate needs.

I never heard another word about the incident. My classmate never mentioned it. My intervention was a service to help others. I only got the chance to help because I had earned the trust of others. Developing a servant's heart is the ultimate learning experience for all students. Every student has giftedness in some area, and using this gift to enrich the lives of others perfects the gift and blesses the servant.








## Book of the Month - Eleanor & Park by Rainbow Rowell







## Learning Through Play in Pre-K

"Play is often talked about as if it were a relief from serious learning. But for children play is serious learning. Play is really the work of childhood." -Mr. Rogers

In our preschool we are working to prepare our students to be successful in a way that inspires a love of learning. We utilize play-based, hands-on learning activities and create well-thought-out, intentional spaces in our classrooms. The play that takes place develops and strengthens many skills



that children will need all throughout their life. Academic skills can be learned best after the foundations



have been set.

Children who play freely are working on their: Communication skills Language development Gross and Fine motor skills Cognitive skills

Running, hopping, dancing, and climbing are examples of activities that foster muscle development and improve motor skills. Children also develop their mental and emotional muscles as they create elaborate, imaginative scenarios that require taking turns, problem solving, reasoning, etc.

As you might guess, at this age, children experience progressive development of their hands. They require development of postural control grasp, fine motor skills, upper and core body strength, proprioceptor control and visual motor integration prior to, and during, the development of writing skills. Playdough, painting, building blocks, threading beads, balancing on logs, and many other play activities develop these skills.

Good oral language skills are essential for a child to be successful, especially at school. Language development is more than just saying words or sentences. It encompasses skills such as problem solving, critical thinking, cause and effect, spatial concepts, etc. Our





dramatic play area is the perfect place for our students to build their language skills, among many others.

These are just a few examples of how our pre-k program is helping to engage children's learning in all developmental areas, while at the same time allowing for individual differences in learning styles and encouraging creativity through a variety of play based experiences.


