According to the Collaborative for Academic, Social and Emotional Learning (CASEL), "SEL is the process through which children and adults acquire and effectively apply the knowledge, attitudes, and skills necessary to understand and manage emotions, set and achieve positive goals, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain positive relationships, and make responsible decisions." When I read this definition I think, that's how people deal with life and succeed!

Schools are no longer just a place for kids to learn knowledge about various subject areas. They are now a place to learn about working with others, forming positive relationships, makes good choices, becoming a well informed citizen, being able to handle everything that life deals them, and the list goes on and on. ### **Board of Education News**

The Board of Education met for the regular board meeting on September 5, 2018. Items discussed and action taken included:

- > Jenna Sedivy presented information to the board about flexible seating and reading in kindergarten.
- Approved the 2018-2019 Tax Request and 2018-2019 Budget. The levy amounts set for the 2018-2019 school year were: .0869298 general fund; .049544 special building fund; .058866 bond fund, and .031943 for QCPUF fund. Total is \$1.009651. This is a slight decrease from last year's levy amounts.
- ➤ Authorized Kim Harms, new Bookkeeper to access Bank records and accounts
- Approved on second reading board policies; 3003.1 bidding for construction, remodeling, repair or related projects financed with federal funds, 3004 General purchasing and procurement, & 3004.1 Fiscal Management for purchasing and procurement using federal funds.

The Board of Education will conduct a special meeting to interview potential candidates to fill the board vacancy. This meeting will be on Thursday, September 27 @ 7:00 p.m. The next regularly scheduled board meeting will be on Tuesday, October 9 @ 7:30 p.m.

The school year is off to a great start here in kindergarten with a group of 17 this year. We've made some exciting changes with our switch to flexible seating and the use of Daily 5 to structure our literacy time. Flexible seating allows the students the opportunity to choose the seating arrangement that is best for their learning. The traditional sedentary classroom setting doesn't allow movement, which enhances the learning process, especially for these young



learners. The brain learns best when students are actively engaged in physical activity. The students are enjoying being independent and also comfortable in our classroom while they learn.



Daily 5 consists of Work on Writing, Read to Self, Word Work, Listen to Reading, and Read to Someone. As the kids learn the different rules and expectations for each of these they become more and more independent during this time, which allows the classroom teacher to work with small groups of students or one-on-one. The students really enjoy the variety of activities that they do each day as well as the chance to move around and take responsibility

for their learning. In less than a month's time this group has gone from being able to sit and " Read to Self" for only 3 minutes to a solid 15 minutes! They are emergent readers and so they are reading the pictures as well as finding the sight words they've




learned. I am enjoying the atmosphere in our classroom and look forward to seeing all the progress that these kids make this year! -Mrs. Sedivy
