From the Principal's Desk by Mr. Davenport Welcome Back - and Looking Ahead

As we kick off another school year, I want to say how proud I am of everything happening here at Sterling Public Schools. We're not just back in the classroom—we're back to doing what we do best: helping every student grow, learn, and feel like they belong.

Over the years, we've worked hard to make sure we're supporting all students, no matter where they are in their learning journey. Our staff has done a fantastic job improving how we meet students' individual needs—making sure no one slips through the cracks. It's been exciting to watch that grow, and I truly believe we're stronger than ever.

Our teachers are at the heart of it all. They care deeply about our students—not just about grades, but about who our kids are as people. And it shows. Whether it's academic achievements, sports, music, or other activities, our students continue to shine at every level. Their success reflects the care and commitment of the people who support them—both in school and across our community.

Sterling Public Schools is more than just a place for learning—it's the center of our town in many ways. From ball games and concerts to meetings and community events, our school is where people come together. It's part of what makes Sterling such a special place. And I truly believe we have one of the most supportive communities anywhere.

But we've also got some challenges we can't ignore. A big part of our school—the oldest section, built back in the 1920s—is showing its age. electrical systems are outdated and expensive to fix—and those fixes happen more often than they should. The roof has recurring leaks, and repairs are temporary at best.

One of our biggest concerns is the kitchen and cafeteria. The kitchen was never meant to be permanent, and it's now literally pulling away from the building. It sits on posts that are sinking, and despite past repairs, the problem keeps coming back. Our cafeteria and activity spaces are also too small, which limits our ability to host events—both for students and for the community. We've even had to pass on hosting larger school events in the past simply because we didn't have the space.

The school board is currently exploring options to address these issues, and no final decisions have been made. But one thing is clear: if we want our school to keep serving as the heart of this community, we need to start planning for the future now.

I'm asking for your support as we move forward with these conversations. Whether you have kids in the district or not, our school touches every part of Sterling. This is about more than classrooms—it's about continuing to give our kids and our community a place to gather, grow, and thrive.

As always, thank you for being part of the Jet family. We're proud to serve this town, and we're excited about what's ahead—with your help.




