Super Notes from Mr. Adrian Allen

With the summer winding down and the 2021-2022 school year quickly approaching, I am getting excited to get everyone back in the building. Our school mission is to educate students to excel, prepare to compete, inspire to serve, and challenge to lead. Our vision is to have our students achieve their full potential. This is something we as a staff, family, and community must strive to accomplish. I am going to challenge everyone to raise their expectations this year and try to achieve greatness. I do not want us to be ok with being average. Our goal is to raise the expectations for everyone, not just students. We want to create a story that we are proud of.

When we return to school on August 16th, masks will NOT be required. However, if you feel your student is safer with the mask they are allowed to wear them. We will continue to monitor the situation and take the necessary precautions to keep the school safe and clean. If you are sick or not feeling well, please stay home. We will still have the ability to Zoom with students and/or get work made up.

This fall we are going to operate an After School program for our students. We are taking registrations in the office. The program will run from 3:30-5:30pm the days we are in session. The cost is a yearly family registration fee of \$25 with an additional \$6 per day, per child. There are NO drop-ins. With limited space we cannot go over a certain limit. Students will be offered a snack after school. If you are interested in taking part in this program, please contact the school office.

The <u>Sterling Foundation</u> is looking for donations for their scholarship program. This group provides Sterling Public School students scholarships each year. The Sterling Foundation offers over \$1000 in scholarships each year to our graduating seniors who apply for this scholarship. Please continue to help this program be successful and give our students some financial assistance as they complete their post secondary programs.

I want to take this time to update everyone on what has been taking place at Sterling Public Schools. It has been a hot summer in the school because our fluid cooler has stopped working. The fluid cooler supplied cool air to certain areas of the facility when it was working. We are in the process of taking bids for the fluid cooler to have it replaced in a timely manner. Unfortunately, we will not have the unit in when school starts. We are still able to keep many parts of the facility cool, but not all. We are circulating air from other areas of the building to keep everything comfortable. We will monitor the situation and take the necessary precautions to ensure the safety of our students. I know this is not an ideal situation and we will do our best. We are sorry for any inconvenience, but we will do our best to make sure everyone is comfortable this fall. We have added two new water bottle filling stations to help prevent the spread of germs. We added one in the elementary wing along with the high school basement. The custodial staff has done a great job of getting the building ready for the upcoming school year. They have painted some rooms, shampooed carpets, stripped floors, and waxed them. The school is looking really sharp. Each year we will make an effort to paint, clean up the facility, and add technology where appropriate. We cannot do it all at once.

School Meals at No Charge for All Students

Effective for School Year 2021-22, Sterling Public Schools will serve meals at no charge to enrolled students. The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has approved use of the Seamless Summer Option (SSO), which allows local school districts to provide no-cost meals to all enrolled students for the duration of the 2021-22 school year.

The new school year requires a new meal application. Although school meals will be provided at no cost to all children, school funding depends on completed meal applications. It is important to submit a complete SY2021-22 meal application as soon as possible.

- Only one meal application is needed for each household.
- Applications are available online at www.sterlingjets.org

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From the Principal's Desk by Mr. Davenport

It is less than a month until school starts again! I hope everyone is as excited as I am and has had a great summer. We have much to look forward to and I believe that we are going to have a great year. In order to make our school year as successful as possible, there are a few updates to our systems and policies that I would like to update everyone on prior to the start of school.

Cell Phones:

Cell phones will not be allowed in the classroom or in the hallways. Students are allowed to bring their cellphones to school but they will be confiscated if seen during class or passing periods. Cell phones will be allowed during the lunch period. Communication between parents and students is still possible at any point throughout the day by calling the school office. Students can also make calls home throughout the day by obtaining permission from their current teacher. This change comes from an effort to decrease classroom distractions, increase engagement and grow social skills.

The current policy states that the first time a cell phone is confiscated it will be returned to the student at the end of the school day. The second offense, parents/ guardians will need to pick up the cell phone for the student. For a third offense, parents/ guardians will need to pick up the cell phone and the student will receive a detention. This policy will not change for this upcoming year.

Grading Updates:

There will also be changes this year to our grading systems in the elementary and high school. Kindergarten through 4th grade teachers have revamped their standards based grading system to reflect the standards being taught in the classrooms. They will also be using a scoring system that will be easier to understand than our previous system. The new system will use a progressive number system rather than letter coding to represent understanding.

Junior High and High School will be transitioning from using quarter grades to semester grading only. Even under the previous system, the semester grade was used to determine if a student received credit for a class. By moving away from quarter grades the focus can and will remain on the grade that matters. The new system will resemble post-secondary education systems and will better prepare students for the future.

Sixth Grade Participation in Junior High Sports:

This year, the sixth grade will also have the opportunity to practice and compete with our junior high. To do this, sixth grade will have their physical education class coincide with the junior high during the final period of the day. This change is due to the small class sizes in the junior high and will allow younger students to gain experience in school organized athletics. Whether or not our sixth grade students participate in our junior high sports is completely optional and up to the student and their parents/ guardians. Everyone must have a physical completed prior to participation. Participation in junior high football is not available for

sixth grade students.

Trapshooting:

The Sterling Board of Education just approved adding trapshooting as an additional opportunity for our students this year. The trapshooting season takes place in the spring. We will provide more details as the program develops. Feel free to contact me with any questions.
