### Sterling Student Chosen to be a Believer and Achiever of the State

Sterling Public schools is thrilled to congratulate this year's Believers and Achievers award recipients. This year, three Sterling High School seniors were chosen as Believers and Achievers. Danielle Janssen and Andrew Richardson were chosen as local Believers and Achievers while Garrett Hier was one of the students chosen to represent the state.

Garrett Hier states that he feels honored to have received this award, and that he believes this will really open up the door for opportunities with scholarships and colleges.

Believers and Achievers was designed to reward high school students in Nebraska for their outstanding excellence in academics and participation in NSAA activities.

In order to be nominated for this award, a student must be a senior in high school and is required to have a minimum GPA of 3.50. Each NSAA member school is allowed to nominate a maximum of four seniors for the Believers and Achievers program. One nomination out of the four must be a student of color. In the event that a school does not have a student of color that meets the program requirements, they are allowed to nominate only three seniors.

Once students have been selected, they then have to deal with the application process. This includes filling out a lengthy application going over academic, athletic, and community involvement. They are also required to submit an essay about how various aspects of high school have impacted them both inside and outside of school.

Here at Sterling Public Schools, there are many programs offered for students. One of the most popular programs is SkillsUSA. Skills is a student lead organization that focuses on preparing each individual student to enter and succeed in today's workforce. There are many benefits from this program, all of which will help students in the real world. Here at Sterling, the Skills chapter is advised by Brian Helmberger, the shop teacher. The chapter allows anyone from six through twelfth grade to join. Currently, the membership fee is set at \$16 per person. The chapter tries to have a meeting once a month for junior high and high school held in the shop building.

So far throughout the year, our Skills chapter has done many things. The Fall Leadership conference held in Hastings is one of the main things completed so far. Here, students got to meet with many industry professionals and explore different careers available. The skills chapter is planning on the fourth annual Christmas party this year. This party is joined by FFA and FBLA. The chapter is currently trying to set a date for this before winter break.

Currently, the biggest excitement in this program is the State Leadership Program held in Grand Island. Students stay overnight in a hotel over a course of a few days. This is the most expensive event in the Skills chapter. The total cost for this trip is estimated to be \$100-125 by Mr. Helmberger. Though the Skills program tries its best to have fundraisers to overcome this cost. So far there have been buttons made, concessions ran, but there is much more to fundraise. More information about the trip and anything happening in Skills will be pushed out soon, so be sure to keep updated on this program.
