
From the Principal's Desk by Mr. Davenport

As we prepare for the second semester, I want to extend my heartfelt gratitude to our community for its ongoing support throughout this school year. I would also like to express my deep appreciation to our dedicated staff and hardworking students. Being part of this school and community is truly a blessing, and I look forward to continuing our successful school year together.

Looking ahead, there are a few important topics I'd like to address. As students prepare to leave for and return from the holiday break, it's essential to acknowledge that Christmas break experiences can vary widely. Not all families exchange gifts or celebrate the holiday season in the same way. Whether these differences stem from tradition, culture, or circumstances, it's important to approach the season with understanding and to focus on enjoying time with loved ones and taking advantage of the much-deserved time away from school.

Please help us remind students to be mindful when returning to school. Our focus at school should remain on learning, not material possessions. While well-meaning, bringing gifts to school can unintentionally create distractions in the classroom. Any gifts or toys brought to school should be limited to designated show-and-tell times.

Additionally, reading is a great activity to prioritize over the holiday break. Reading has been a school improvement goal since I joined the Jet family 10 years ago, and your continued support is invaluable in helping us achieve these goals. If you're a parent or guardian of a younger child, reading with them can significantly boost their progress. Reading builds vocabulary, enhances focus, and nurtures a lifelong love of learning. This encouragement also applies to older students, who can experience similar benefits. Please remind students to visit our school library before the break. Kindergarten and 1st-grade students may check out one book at a time, 2nd through 5th-grade students may check out two, and middle and high school students may borrow up to five books.



From the Principal's Desk continued...

I have always had the attitude that no news is good news. I try to communicate any and all issues with parents as they arise; however, I figured I should provide everyone with a brief overview of my discipline philosophy.

When it comes to discipline within the school, my decisions are formed easily. Nearly all conduct expectations and consequences are black and white in legislation or in our student handbook, as adopted by the Board of Education. If situations could have legal ramifications, I contact the county attorney or the Johnson County Sheriff's Office. In all situations, I try to remain as objective as possible.

While I am sympathetic to the root causes of behaviors, when a student is sent to the office to discuss a specific behavior, that behavior will remain the focus of the conversation. All reasons or explanations for the behavior can certainly be discussed at a later date (and I am interested), but in the moment, I focus on the choices the student made. Often, the events around us cannot be predicted or controlled, but everyone must take responsibility for their personal response to those events.

I also want to clarify the difference between behaviors that are handled in the classroom and those that are referred to the office, so parents have a better understanding of what I may be responsible for addressing.

Most everyday behaviors are managed by teachers in the classroom. This includes things like calling out, off-task behaviors, side talking, horseplay, or small disputes between students. Teachers also address inappropriate language, teasing, tattling, and other moments of disrespect. Occasionally, a student may misplace or damage property, or return something they took without permission—these situations are handled directly by the teacher. Even social-emotional moments, such as crying or general frustration, are often managed within the classroom setting. Teachers work to maintain a safe and focused environment while helping students learn appropriate behavior and responsibility.

Certain behaviors, however, rise to a level that requires office involvement. This includes aggressive actions, bullying, fighting, harassment, or any threats to safety. More serious incidents such as stealing items that are not returned, major property destruction, or possession of drugs, alcohol, or weapons are also addressed at the office level. Additionally, if a student repeatedly demonstrates multiple minor behaviors in a short period of time, this can become an office-managed situation. When these events occur, my role is to ensure safety, apply our policies fairly, and guide students toward learning from the situation.

Lastly, I want everyone to know that I take no pleasure in levying discipline, but I do believe it is necessary for growth. I do not take misbehavior personally and will never hold anything against a student. We all learn lessons and move on. Above all, I promise that any discipline given at school will be far less severe than the real-world repercussions students could face if they do not learn these lessons now.

As always, please do not hesitate to reach out to me as needed. 
