2023 season review: We will miss last year's seniors for sure this year. Andrew Harms placed 1st in the 110 Hurdles, 3rd in the 300 Hurdles, 5th in the High Jump, and was the anchor for our 4x400 Relay which won 1st place as well. He is doing track at Doane University this year. Macy Richardson placed 1st in the 100 Hurdles, 2nd in the 300 Hurdles, 4th in the Long Jump, and 3rd in the Triple Jump at the big meet last year as well. She is now playing softball at the University of Minnesota.

Outlook for the 2024 season: We have 19 boys and 7 girls out for track this year. We also have some 2023 State Qualifiers back this year. Wyatt Rathe was on the 4x400 gold medal team and qualified in the 200m Dash. Jesus Gonzalez Castillo was on the 4x400 relay team as well and placed 7th in the 800m Run. Collin Kinney also received a gold medal as part of the 4x400 Relay. Lauren Harms went to state in the discus throw and shot put. She placed 7th in the discus.

Besides our State qualifiers, we have several other returning letter winners from last year who scored a lot of points. They include Brody Horstman, Ridge Bredthauer, Sierra Goracke, Ellie Lafferty, and Chloe Waters. We look forward to their success this year.
