To explain the information above: NeSA is the Nebraska State Assessments. These are the tests that all students in all public schools in Nebraska take in the spring each year.

The results that are listed are from the state tests that our students took last spring of 2013. There are a total of 249 public school districts in Nebraska. The largest is Omaha Public Schools with 50,559 students K-12 and the smallest is Loup County Public Schools with 88 students in grades K-12. NePAS is Nebraska Performance Accountability System. The NePAS ranks all 249 public school districts in the areas of reading, math and science. The average of reading scores for Sterling students last spring in grades 3-8 and 11 was 110.81 compared to the state average of 114.54 the ranking of Sterling Public School District was then 166 out of the 249 districts. The average for math of the Sterling students in grades 3-8 and 11 was 113.09 and the state average was 106.09 with a rank of 95 out of the 249 school districts. The average of the Sterling students in grades 5, 8 and 11 in science was 112.68 and the state average was 103.25 for a rank of 71 out of 249 school districts.

Sterling FFA Members attended the 86th FFA National Convention in Louisville, KY.

Energy Class Goes to State School Board

On Friday, November 22nd, three students and Mr. Salberg traveled to Omaha, Nebraska, for the Nebraska State School Board Convention. Terrell Hobbs, Trey Trauernicht, and Rhet Dirks shared an energy demonstration using skills they have learned throughout the semester so far.



The Energy course is made possible in cooperation with the Educational Service Unit #4 in Auburn, NE. In this course, students are given a unique approach to understanding energy and learning about the many, varied career opportunities in the energy field. The course offers the chances to engage in the study of energy basics and fundamentals, the production and delivery of energy, and energy responsibilities and decisions. The opportunities for students to explore energy-related topics through hands-on experiences and field trips to state-of-the-art energy facilities and interact with experts in this industry are fundamental to this course.

Not only did the students have this opportunity, but the class toured the E-Energy Ethanol plant by Adams and the Beatrice Energy Plant

on Wednesday, November 20th. The 8th grade Earth Science class was also able to tour the Adams E-Energy ethanol plant with the energy class.

Additionally, the energy class has had the opportunities to take field trips to the Rockport Wind Farm, Black Hills Energy, and the NPPD Sheldon Station by Hallam. Speakers who have shared their time and expertise with the students include Jeff McCartney from the Cooper Nuclear Plant and NPPD linesmen from Pawnee City. What a great learning opportunity for our students!



NeSA Testing Coming Up

Each year, during a three-week window in January and February, 4th, 8th and 11th grade students across the state of Nebraska hunker down to take the NeSA-Writing assessment. Then in the spring, during an approximate six week window, students in grades 3 through 8 and 11 take the NeSA-Reading and Math assessments. During this same spring testing window, students in grades 5, 8, and 11 take the NeSA Science assessments.

What exactly are the NeSA assessments, and why are you children taking these tests? NeSA tests are statedeveloped assessments and the results of these assessments are used for both state and federal accountability reports. Nebraska data is reported in grades 4, 8, and 11 with the exception of science, which is assessed in grade 5 instead of 4th grade. Federally for Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) reporting, all students in grades 3 through 8 are assessed.

Field Trip to the Strategic Air and Space Museum

The third, fourth, and fifth graders took a field trip to the Strategic Air and Space Museum this month. There were three rotations that each group got to participate in.

The math workshop was led by one of the employees of the SAC museum. She taught the students a lesson on probability. Each student got to create a spinner and a chart that they used to predict the probability of the spinner landing on certain colors which were also different sizes. After a few minutes of spinning, most students figured out that the probability is higher of landing on a colored piece that was larger in size. The objectives that were met in this lesson were learning about fractions, creating a device to predict probability, and graphing results.

The MATH ALIVE! exhibit was a chance for students to explore over 40 interactive math exhibits. The exhibits focused on many different math concepts such as graphing, shadows, robotics, music rhythms, developing skills to create a video game, and so much more! Students were able to race on bikes, race on snowboards, climb a rock wall, create video games, and control robots. This was a very fun way for the students to learn math!

Finally, the students were able to walk through the two hangars at the museum. Math was incorporated into this

by having the students go on a scavenger hunt. Each airplane had a sign with information next to it. The students had to read the information, and find the dates that the airplane was in service for. Once they found the dates, they had to calculate how many years it was in service and then they were able to move on to the next airplane on their map. The students seemed to have enjoyed the history of these airplanes as they asked many great questions and were excited to see how large the airplanes were. The skills taught with the scavenger hunt were reading a map and subtracting dates.

The field trip to the SAC Museum was a great experience. Who knew math could be so fun?!
