Low Lunch Balances - Thank you for your help throughout the year in keeping your child(rens) lunch and breakfast balance paid up! As we get close to the end of the year, please keep your balances at or above \$0.00. We will send reminders home the last few days of school and appreciate you taking care of negative balances before the last day of school.

Gym Update - We are getting closer to having the work completed in our gym. The floor is stained, painted, and sealed, bleachers are installed, we're ready for spring programs and graduation, and then the gym floor will be finished. Unfortunately, the floor will be covered during the spring programs and graduation, but we will have a video playing outside the gym for everyone to see during our spring programs and events. Since the finish coats are not applied to the floor, we need to do our best to protect the paint with tarps during these end-of-the-year events. Please take the time to watch the video to see what the floor looks like.

Gym Lights - We will be replacing our current lights in the gym with energy efficient LED fixtures. This will provide monthly energy savings and these fixtures will pay for themselves over time. This project will take place over the summer.

Gym Scoreboards - With all of the work that has been done in the gym, we are looking at the possibility of getting new scoreboards as well. As a part of the video being played outside the gym during upcoming programs and events, pictures of possible scoreboards will be displayed. In order for this to happen, we are asking for donations for new scoreboards. New scoreboards will cost approximately \$10,000 and in order for us to be able to replace them, we will need to cover half of that cost from donations. Additional information about donating towards this scoreboard project can be found outside the gym at these spring events, as well as in the school office.

We will eventually be looking at donations to help with this as well, if we want to upgrade the speakers and sound system in the gym), EHA Health Saving Account option, Summer Custodial / Facilities Projects.
- We are planning to have a board work session with Gil Peace, our architect, at 6:45 on May 16, followed by the regular meeting at 7:30.

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
Teaching has always been my passion. I absolutely love school and can't wait to pass my love for learning on to my students.

GIRLS' STATE REPRESENTATIVE

Alisha Fisher of Sterling, will be representing Bickel Nelson Legion Auxiliary #360 from Cook, Nebraska, and will join other high school juniors from across Nebraska participating in the American Legion Cornhusker Girl's State, Sunday, June 5th through Saturday, June 11th at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln Sandoz Residence Hall.

Alisha is a junior at Sterling Public Schools. Her school activities include band, FFA, SkillsUSA, One-Act Play, volleyball, basketball, and track. Out of school, Alisha is involved in Spoons and Spools 4-H Club and Luther League. She has been a consistent Honor Roll student through her junior high and high school years. She is a member of St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church in Sterling, Nebraska. Alisha is the daughter of Danny and Artis Fisher of Sterling.

The American Legion Auxiliary developed a citizenship training program based on the formation of the American Legion's Boys State program. This program offers training in the positive processes of self-government and good citizenship as practiced in democratic societies.

Girls State began as one and two day sessions in the late 1930's. In 1939, Girls State was altered to make it a week-long government education program. Since 1948, it has been a regular part of the Auxiliary's Americanism curriculum.

The program is funded by the American Legion Auxiliary with some additional support coming from other civic and non-profit organizations. Little or no expense is required of the delegates and her family.

Each summer approximately 25,000 young women participate in Girls State sessions across the nation. At Girls State, the delegates study local, county, and state government. The girls do this by setting up their own miniature city, county, and state governments and administer them according to the rules and procedures set by Nebraska's laws.

After arriving at Cornhusker Girls State, the citizens are divided into 12 towns named after the Presidents of the United States. The citizens are also divided into two political parties -- the Federalists and the Nationalists. These parties do not reflect the two major political parties in today's system of government. The parties allow citizens to gain knowledge of how a two-party system operates.

Girls State citizens participate in these mock political parties and elections are held to fill city, county, and state positions. Other activities include legislative sessions, campaigning, party rallies, mock trials, and debating. The citizens also receive instruction in Parliamentary Procedure.

NLS REPRESENTATIVE

Congratulations to Kaleb Williams who has been chosen as Sterling's representative to attend Nebraska Leadership Seminar (NLS), which will be held at Midland University in Fremont, Nebraska from June 16th through the 19th.

NLS was founded in 1978 and incorporated as a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization in 1983. From its inception the goal of NLS has been to provide future Nebraska leaders with an opportunity to identify and develop their leadership skills by participating in a four-day residential conference environment.

NLS is intended for Nebraska high school students between their sophomore and junior year. All Nebraska high schools have the opportunity to nominate two students, referred to as delegates, to participate in this unique experience. Students receiving this honor are exposed to interactive team building activities, keynote speakers from around the country, current events discussions, and a community service project aiding them in the discovery, development, and application of their leadership skills. Delegates are encouraged and supported as they voice their personal perspectives while learning to appreciate and respect opinions that differ from their own. Peer interaction is built into the program to promote bonds and friendships with other student leaders from across the state. Further adding to the experience, in 2001 NLS partnered with the Gallup Organization offering the delegates the opportunity to participate in the Clifton's StrengthsFinder Assessment.

NLS, from the Corporate Board, Planning Committee, Alumni Association, and Seminar staff, is composed entirely of Nebraska volunteers. The dedication and passion demonstrated by these individuals to provide future Nebraska leaders with this experience has made a difference in the lives of over 6,000 students from over 300 school districts across the state. NLS is a program that is recognized by higher education institutions and has been instrumental in securing scholarships for a number of students who have been privileged to attend.

The winners for fifth grade were: 1st place - Gracyn Dolbow; 2nd place - Kaylin Smith; and 3rd place - Andrew Harms.


Sixth grade winners were: 1st place - Garrett Hier; 2nd place - Jordan Cano; and 3rd place - Zeke Topp.




