Accomplishments over the last year...

Facilities

- » Improving the air quality in the school with the Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning Project.
- » Fencing around the basketball court and playground.
- » The addition of two brand new vans for transportation.
- » The addition of cameras on the route buses.
- » Upgrading the kitchen by replacing the two confection ovens and purchasing a fruit and vegetable serving bar.
- » The Board of Education Building and Grounds Committee is working with an architect for future building improvement projects, including a new playground for PreK and lower elementary students.

Educational Programs

- » Starting the first ever Sterling FFA and TeamMates Chapters.
- » Bringing the Missoula Children's Theatre to the elementary students.
- » The formation of the Health and Wellness Committee and activities: The elementary walking club in the mornings before school, the "Second Chance Breakfast" for the students in grades 7-12, joining the Fuel Up to Play 60, and The Whole Child Project.
- » The PreK Expansion Grant increasing the enrollment from 8 to 18 and increasing to all day-every day PreK.
- » The Title I Expansion from part-time to full-time and implementing the SRA Corrective Reading program.
- » Technology Improvements: Mimio Projectors in the 2nd, 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade classroom with more being planned. Two carts, each with 20 iPads, for the elementary classrooms. An additional cart of 20 laptop computers for the Jr. & Sr. High School classrooms. All staff will be attending the Nebraska Educational Technology Association Conference in April.
- » Improving teacher effectiveness with adopting Marzano teaching strategies and attending the Marzano Academy V this summer.

Financial

- » The district saved \$156,060 in 2013-14 compared to 2012-13.
- » The general fund cash reserves improved by \$333,053 in 2013-14.
- » Starting a Special Building Fund in 2013-14 and the ending balance was \$118,729 and an additional \$150,000 added in 2014-15 for future building projects.
- » Lowering the general fund tax in 2014-15 by \$215,377.
- » Upgrading to the Harris School Solutions AptA Fund Accounting Program and consolidating the checking accounts.
- » eFunds for Schools allows parents to pay for meals on line via ACH from their checking account or credit cards. Contact Steph at extension 101 if you would like assistance setting up your family for eFunds lunch payments.

Board of Education

- » The BOE showing appreciation to the staff through commendations, the Welcome Back to School Picnic, and providing spiral hams at Christmas.
- » Updating the Board Policies and plans to finish all the policies, then making them available for all on the school website.
- » Board member local training and attending Nebraska Association of School Boards Conferences.

I informed the Board of Education at the December meeting that I will be retiring at the end of this year. This is my second retirement. My total tenure is 38 years in Education: 27 years as a high school Agriculture Education teacher and FFA Advisor with 11 years as a Superintendent of Schools.

Welcome Back!!! I hope everyone enjoyed a longer Christmas Break than normal for the second year in a row. We avoided using any snow days during the first semester and are on schedule, but you never know what Mother Nature has in store for the second semester. Our first semester was very successful as usual and I am eagerly looking forward to a strong finish during the second half of the 2014-15 school year. With that being said, here are some items for your consideration as we roll into 2015.

Sportsmanship. As we are now in the middle of our winter sports season, I want to remind everyone that positive sportsmanship is an expectation for everyone. The Sterling Junior class enjoyed County Government Day on December 8th in Tecumseh. The day began with the introduction of county officials and Legion members. The students then went on a scavenger hunt to the various offices to find information, from where to get a license to being married in the courthouse. Next was the "Jeopardy Competition" on County Government. In a close contest with JCC, the Sterling Junior Class was victorious! Judge Daniel Bryan then led a witness memory simulation in which the students were asked to repeat what they heard about a crime to other students. In this demonstration, Judge Bryan enforced the notion that not all testimony is as accurate as it may appear.

We then had lunch sponsored by the Johnson County Ladies Auxiliary which was delicious. Following the noon luncheon, the students returned to the courtroom and a Mock Trial was played out by both schools. Sterling was the plaintiff and JCC was the defense. This learning experience was enhanced by Judge Bryan's leadership as he coached each student on the do's and don'ts of what attorneys and witnesses encounter during a trial.

The afternoon concluded with the Sheriff from Nemaha County giving a demonstration on distracted driving. Several students were given the opportunity to use a device to see firsthand what it is like being distracted with electronic devise while using a motor vehicle. -4 Wheelin' Physics: Youth will use a remote controlled truck to learn basic physics principles such as friction, velocity, energy and force with interactive exciting activities. The workshop runs from after school to 5:30pm on January 15. It is open to students, grades 3-6 and only costs \$10.

-Vet Science: Youth will participate in hands on activities to enhance their understanding of an animal's biology and their behaviors. By the end of the workshop, youth will have the skills to assess the health and well-being of multiple animals. The workshop runs from after school to 5:30pm on February 10. It is open to students, grades 3-6 and only costs \$10.

-Power of Wind: youth will practice designing and redesigning different wind powered objects while learning about how wind speed is measured. The workshop runs from after school to 5:30pm on March 12. It is open to students, grades 3-6 and only costs \$10.

-Upcycle for Earth: Youth will learn about the harmful effect humans have on the environment along with simple solutions to help protect the earth for future generations. -Rockets to the Rescue: Youth will be tasked with one mission: to design and build an aerodynamic food transportation device that can deliver a payload of nutritious food to disaster victims.
