- Approved offering the Class of 2019 the option to purchase their MacBook computer for \$900 at the end of the year. If parents are interested in purchasing these they should contact Mr. Harrington to determine how payment will be made.
- They selected a contractor for snow removal and accepted a bid for the 2003 Dodge Caravan Grand Sport.
- Board Members Wirthele and Harms reported on board workshops they have attended in the last month.
- Approved the consent agenda as presented.
- Reports were shared with them in regards to some of the college and job shadow visits that have occurred, preparations for college for the seniors, basketball update, QPR Suicide Prevention training that all teachers were trained in, and School Board's Convention law updates.
- The next regularly scheduled monthly board meeting will be on Monday, December 17th at 7:30 p.m. in the Media Center.

Conversations About School

Now that the school year is in full force I wanted to share some tips to engage your student in conversations about school. Supporting your child's education at home is one of the most important things you can do to help your student be successful at school. Asking "How was school today?" might not get you very much information or any meaningful conversation with your student. So try asking questions/comments like:

- What was the coolest thing to happen at school today?
- What made you laugh at school today?
- What was the most creative thing you did today?
- Pretend you're the teacher. How would you describe the day? Could also modify this question by inserting a content area such as, How would you describe history class today?
- Tell me what you learned that you'd like to know more about?
- How were you kind or helpful today?
- How was someone kind or helpful to you?
- Show me what you have for homework.
- What was the hardest thing you had to do today?
- Which one of your teachers would survive a zombie apocalypse? Why?
- What assignment or class did you just rock today?

Engaging your student in a meaningful conversation about their school day not only tells your child that you value them, but also their education. Another place to look for conversation starters would be your students' online classroom management system. Whether it be Class Dojo, SeeSaw, or Google Classroom, all of these systems provide a wealth of information about what is happening in your child's classroom. Here is a recap of tasks you should complete this fall to stay on track.

- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) using the FSA ID you created during our Apply2College Event.
 - Both you and your parent will need an FSA ID that can be created at fsaid.ed.gov. You'll need it to access and sign the FAFSA. [Click here](#) for instructions.
 - Review the [FAFSA Checklist](#) for a list of items to gather before you start the form.
 - Complete the FAFSA at fafsa.gov.
 - For free help with the FAFSA, see FAFSA Tools at EducationQuest.org or call EducationQuest to make an appointment: Omaha – 888.357.6300, Lincoln – 800.303.3745
- Send in any last minute applications.
- Make yourself aware of scholarship deadlines at the colleges you have applied at.**
- Retake the ACT if the college(s) you are considering will still accept your score.
- See ScholarshipQuest at EducationQuest.org for Nebraska-based scholarships and a list of national search sites. More scholarships are added each month. Local Scholarship information will be coming in late January or early February.

JUNIORS...

Start researching colleges. If you narrow your college choices by the end of your junior year, your senior year will be less stressful. Here's how to get started:

- Review *College Profiles* at EducationQuest.org for information about colleges in Nebraska and across the country. If you're interested in an out-of-state school, check out the Midwest Student Exchange Program to learn about tuition discounts.
- Meet with college representatives who visit your school, and then visit the websites of the colleges that interest you to learn more about the schools.
- Once you've narrowed your choices, schedule campus visits. Try to visit in the spring of your junior year while colleges are still in session. You get 3 college visit days to use either your junior or senior year.
