Board of Education News for December 2018

The Board of Education met for its regular monthly meeting on December 17, 2018. Board Members Agena, Harms, Hestermann, Horstman, Vollman and Wirthele were all present. Also in attendance were Superintendent Dottie Heusman, Principal Scott Harrington, Transportation Director Brent Heusman, and Guidance Counselor Addie Heusman. Stan Karr and Kevin McAuliffe were also in attendance. They will be sworn in as board members at the January meeting. They will be replacing Lois Agena and Mike Hestermann.

Items that were discussed during the meeting included:

- Galen Boldt, Interim Superintendent at JCC presented information to the board about the public meetings he has been conducting with the JCC communities.
- During the Public Comment section of the meeting Connie Nemec addressed the board about board policy 5006. Kirsten McAuliffe representing the Sterling Zoning Committee shared information about a possible zoning change.
- Jeff Deline Accountant at Dana Cole presented information to the board about the 2017-2018 school year financial audit. The board accepted the document during action items.
- Commendations were given to Mr. Derrick Gossard for his work with the Pep Band, Band, and Music students this year. Volleyball and football athletes that received honors were also recognized.
- Superintendent Heusman's Contract was renewed for the 2019-2020 school year.
- > The board had first reading on the Wellness Policy (5417 & 5417AR).
- > Annually the board also reviews policy 5006 Option Enrollment. First reading was held for this policy.
- > The Board presented outgoing board members Hestermann and Agena with a clock for their dedication to the students at Sterling Public Schools.

The Board is holding a retreat on Wednesday, January 16. This meeting will be facilitated by Marcia Herring from the Nebraska Association of School Boards organization. The board will be looking at goal setting during this meeting. The next regularly scheduled meeting will be Monday, January 21, 2018 @ 7:30 p.m. in the Media Center at Sterling Public School.

Parent-School Communication...

We find that students are most successful when parents and teachers work together. The next day for Parent-Teacher Conferences is around the corner on February 7th. Parent-teacher conferences give you the chance to find out how your child(ren) are doing in class. You can try the following tips to get the most out of conferences:

Before Conferences

O Prepare a list of question to take along and ask. Examples include: "What should my child know or be able to do by the end of the year?" "How does my child get along with or interact with their peers and adults?" "Do you have any concerns about my child ?"

O Feel free to share any information that might help teachers understand your child. You could share, strengths, weaknesses, hobbies, and interests (video games, music, movies, TV shows).

O Also consider sharing any personal news or changes that could be happening at home that may be affecting your child (i.e. a death in the family or pet, moving to a new house, etc.).

During Conferences

O Make notes so you can remember points to share with your child or to follow up on later.

O Listen carefully to the teacher and then mention your most important concern first in case time runs out or you get to talking about different subjects/topics.

O Ask for guidance or resources on how you can help your child be successful.

O If you need more time, ask the teacher if you could schedule another meeting or maybe a phone call or email.

• After Conferences

O Be sure to talk to your child(ren) about what the teacher said.

O Be sure to include both compliments, as well as, areas to improve.

O Feel free to follow up with the teacher as needed for further clarification or resources or to simply check your child's progress. As always, a great place to check for child's progress is through our online learning management systems. Whether it be Class Dojo, Bloomz, SeeSaw, or Google Classroom, the teachers are constantly updated their platforms with tons of great information.

College Access...

Some of you may remember that I applied for and received a College Access Grant from Education Quest for the next four years. This grant money is used to help students gain access to college visits and resources that might otherwise not have funding. Some of our visits we have been on are class visits and others are optional based on student interests. The visits included SCC Milford's Career Construction day, an Educational Planning Program in Beatrice, Doane College, University of Nebraska Lincoln, Nebraska Wesleyan University, SCC Lincoln Health programs, Bryan School of Nursing, Peru State College, and Northwest Missouri State University. Some of the highlights of our tours were the stadium visit at UNL, hearing directly from instructors about their respective programs at SCC, seeing the plasticized bodies at Bryan Health, listening to the Dean's speak at Peru State, and student's experiencing first time college visits along the way. If you have had a student that has been fortunate enough to go on one of these visits, it would be worthwhile to have a conversation with them about their experience. More trips are planned for this Spring.
